



## Conflict Materials Policy

GMA Manufacturing LLC is actively surveying our supply chain and currently has not confirmed any "conflict minerals", as defined in "Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, as well as California Senate Bill 861" in our supply chain. "Conflict materials" are defined as using materials from the Democratic Republic of the Congo or any adjoining countries ("DRC Countries") in the manufacture of products.

"Conflict Minerals" include:

- columbite-tantalite, also known as coltan (the metal ore from which tantalum is extracted)
- cassiterite (the metal ore from which tin is extracted)
- gold
- wolframite (the metal ore from which tungsten is extracted)
- their derivatives
- any other mineral or its derivatives determined by the Secretary of State to be financing conflict in the DRC Countries.

GMA fully supports this legislation and is committed to responsible sourcing as well as full compliance with the requirements of the Rule. GMA does not directly purchase from mines, smelters or refiners and is typically several or more stages removed from these activities. Suppliers who supply components and material are expected to acquire those items from conflict complaint socially responsible sources and to have policies and procedures in place as well as perform all necessary due diligence to confirm that products and parts supplied to GMA are conflict free.
